

The funds raised in 1998 will support the community in three crucial ways:

Flexible Funding to Target Emerging Needs: United Way will continue to meet gaps in service by funding Innovation and Expansion Grants that help youth improve school performance and reduce truancy and juvenile crime; and help adults become self-sufficient by transitioning into the work force and obtaining livable-wage employment. One of United Way's unique qualities has always been its fast response to meeting needs.

A Continued Focus on Results and Prevention: Currently, 71 percent of United Way funding supports services for children, youth and families. These programs work to improve academic achievement, increase the number of stable homes by helping parents obtain living wage jobs, and provide mentoring relationships between youth and adults. And, 65 percent of United Way funding is targeted to preventive programs like these which are designed to avert problems before they occur.

Powerful Solutions Through Partnerships: United Way is providing leadership in changing systems and removing barriers to success through partnerships with business, government and nonprofits. These collaborations provide people access to the help they need in a timely and appropriate manner.

While the overall success of the fund-raising campaign can be measured in several ways, the bottom line is people are realizing that the only way to make significant change is by taking personal responsibility. And, th are stepping forward to do so in greater numbers. The true success of United Way is based on individual gifts from hundreds of thousands of people. The following are also key factors attributed to helping United Way exceed its 1998 fund-raising goal:

- An 8 percent increase in giving through workplace employee campaigns.
- Corporate giving increasing by 5.5 percent.
- Individuals giving at the \$5,000 level and above increased by more than \$1 million.
- The 114 organizations running United Way campaigns for the first time, reaching more than 13,000 employed
- More than 175 early campaigns posting an increase of more than \$1.5 million.
- Ten companies raising more than \$1 million each this year; five of which raised more than \$2 million.

This experience has been a challenging and gratifying experience. And, as I look to the 1999 campaign, I can only wish greater success to co-chairs John and Leslie Turner. Living and working in this wonderful community, I am optimistic and confident that people will increasingly invest in United Way as a vehicle for building a strong community as we proceed into the next millennium. Together we have seen first-hand that can make a difference. What Is A Leaders In Giving Campaign, and Why Is It Important?

A Leaders in Giving campaign is one of the most effective strategies to increase individual giving within an organization. Leaders in Giving is a targeted approach and recognition effort enlisting support from an organization's leadership and management team. As a campaign tactic, it is easy to implement in a company of any size and can be a source of new dollars. It is also an effective program for organizations running their first United Way campaign, as well as those organizations with a long tradition of annual United Way giving.

What does a Leaders in Giving campaign look like?

The typical target audience for this solicitation is senior management or highly compensated employees. Large employee campaigns frequently recruit a coordinator to organize and conduct this portion of the overall campaign. United Way has a speaker's bureau of strong, dynamic volunteers comprised of recognized community leaders who conduct presentations to the Leaders in Giving audiences. Because the solicitation is usually accomplished with one meeting or a series of peer-to-peer requests, the campaign can be wrapped up quickly. The peer-to-peer solicitation method of Leaders in Giving is also one of the reasons this solicitation method is successful.

What are some of the benefits to conducting a Leaders in Giving campaign?

Increased giving is one of the greatest benefits. For that reason, a Leaders in Giving campaign is an especially successful tactic for Pacesetter campaigns. Recognition is also a very important benefit for both the individual donor and the organization. United Way takes the information provided by each organization and acknowledges both the individual donor along with the organization conducting the Leaders in Giving campaign. The donor names and participating organizations are published in the Annual Highlights Book and Leaders in Giving materials dedicated to recognition listings. These materials are distributed to over 7,000 individuals throughout the Twin Cities.

What does a Leaders in Giving contribution mean to the donor?

Recognition is provided for individual donors, balanced with respect for those individuals who prefer anonymity. There are eight recognition levels of Leaders in Giving contributions. At the entry level of \$500 per year, it means less than \$20 per pay period on an annual 26 pay period cycle. One very compelling reason individuals, who desire recognition, participate in this program is that it allows recognition for combined partner giving – for example, if each spouse contributed \$250 each at their respective workplace, they can be recognized jointly as Leaders in Giving contributors.
